PARKING ORDINANCE

1984 - 1

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that the following ordinance was duly adopted at a regular meeting on November 20, 1984 after a public hearing.

SECTION 1. TITLE: This Ordinance shall be known as the Parking Ordinance of the Village of Tannersville, 1984-1.

SECTION 2. LEGISLATIVE INTENT: Due to the traffic congestion within the Village due to increased motor vehicle usage, narrow streets and in consideration of the public health, safety and welfare, it is necessary for the Village Board of the Village of Tannersville to restrict parking on certain streets in order to facilitate vehicular travel and access for emergency vehicles including fire trucks, ambulances and police vehicles.

SECTION 3. MAIN STREET PARKING:

A. Parking is permitted on the South side of Main Street from the Village line to Village line, except as prohibited and limited below.

1. Parking is limited to two hours on the South side of Main Street from the intersection of South Main Street to the traffic light at the intersection of Railroad Avenue.
2. Parking is prohibited between the hours of 5 a.m. to 7 a.m.
3. Parking is prohibited on the bridge crossing Allen Brook.

B. Parking is prohibited on the North side of Main Street along its entire length from Village line to Village line.

SECTION 4. PARKING PROHIBITIONS - BOTH SIDES OF STREET:

Parking is prohibited on both sides of the following streets: Grays Lane, Spruce Street, Lakeview Avenue, Church Street, Hill Street, Spring Street Extension (from Sylvan Side Avenue north to Village line), Railroad Avenue (also known as Dugway) from traffic light to intersection of South Main Street; parking is prohibited on the triangle formed by the intersection of Railroad Avenue and South Main Street.

SECTION 5. PARKING PROHIBITIONS - ONE SIDE OF STREET:

Parking is prohibited on one side of the following streets as set forth therein: East side of Spring Street; South side of Sylvan Side Avenue; East side of Park Lane; South side of Fromer Street; North side of South Main Street to intersection of Railroad Avenue; East Side of Tompkins Street; West side of Renwick Street; West side of Raspberry Lane; South side of Southview Avenue (also known as Penrose Park); North side of Sunset Avenue; North and East side of Lake Road.

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SECTION 6. VILLAGE PARKING LOT:

Parking is prohibited in the Village Parking Lot from November 1st to April 30th, between the hours of 5 a.m. and 9 a.m.

SECTION 7. TOW AWAY ZONES:

All "no parking areas" shall be and hereby are declared Tow Away Zones. Vehicles illegally parked may be towed. All towing charges shall be borne solely by the owner or operator of the motor vehicle and shall be in addition to any fines or other penalties.

SECTION 8. SNOW EMERGENCY: SNOW TIRES AND CHAINS

A. During the months of November 1 to May 1 and during any snow storm, the Village Board may declare a snow emergency. During the snow emergency, parking is prohibited on all streets, roads and parking lots within the Village.

B. Any motor vehicle driven or parked in the Village of Tannersville during the period of November 1 to May 1 and not equipped with snow tires, chains or their equivalent shall be in violation of this ordinance in the event that such vehicle becomes snow-bound.

SECTION 9. VIOLATIONS:

Any person violating this ordinance shall be ^gquilty of a violation and shall be subject to a fine not to exceed Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) for the first violation; One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for the second violation within six months; Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) within six months for a third violation.

SECTION 10. REVOCATION OF PRIOR ORDINANCES:

All prior ordinances relating to the parking in the Village of Tannersville including the ordinances of 1959, 1969, 1971, 1976, 1978 and 1980 ¹⁹⁸⁴ are hereby revoked and repealed and superseded.

SECTION 11. SEVERABILITY:

In the event that any section, clause or portion of this ordinance shall be held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not effect the validity of the remaining sections of this ordinance.

This ordinance shall take effect ten (10) days from its adoption and publication.



RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, by Resolution dated November 20, 1984, the Village of Tannersville advised the New York State Department of Transportation (DOT) of its approval and endorsement of Alternative No. 2 in conjunction with the DOT Main Street Reconstruction Project which alternative entailed on-street parking as the best alternative in the interests of the Village of Tannersville with certain amendments set forth in said resolution; and


WHEREAS, DOT has agreed to convey to the appropriate municipality, subject to said municipality conveying to the adjoining landowner all that land lying on either side of New York State Route 23A in the Village of Tannersville formerly claimed by DOT, subject to the determinations of the New York State Department of Law; and

WHEREAS, subsequent to the above determinations, the Village Board appointed a committee to study the entire situation which committee has met with representatives of DOT on a number of occasions; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the meetings between the Village, the committee and DOT a modified plan encompassing both on-street and off-street parking within the Village of Tannersville has been proposed;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Village Board of Trustees of the Village of Tannersville unanimously approve and endorse the modified plan calling for a mixture of on-street and off-street parking as the alternative which is in the best interests of the Village of Tannersville, its residents and business community; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that to the extent that said modified alternative does not conflict with the November 20, 1984 Resolution or any other resolution of the Village of Tannersville pertaining to this project that such prior resolutions shall remain in full force and effect. To the extent that the modified plan does conflict with any prior resolution of the Village of Tannersville pertaining thereto, the modified plan as adopted by this resolution shall supersede and replace said prior resolution.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that after a public hearing was held on November 3, 1978 at 7:00 P.M. the following ordinance was adopted pursuant to Section 5.5 of the Village Law.

ORDINANCE #79-2

PARKING ORDINANCE

Section 1. All prior ordinances relating to parking in the Village of Tannersville, including the ordinances of 1959, 1969, 1971 and 1976, are hereby repealed.

Section 2. Parking is prohibited entirely on Gray's Lane, Spruce Street, Lakeview Avenue, Church Street, Hill Street, Lake Road and the Spring Street extension from the intersection of Park Lane Street to the Village boundary, all of which are declared Tow Away Zones.

Section 3. Parking is prohibited on the south side of Fromer Street, South Main Street and Penrose Park; the north side of Main Street; the east side of Park Lane and Tompkins Street; and the west side of Raspberry Lane, Renwick Street, remainder of Spring Street, and Railroad Avenue through the Dugway and from Penrose Park to Lakeview Avenue.

Section 4. Parking is prohibited on the south side of Main Street from 5:00 A.M. to 7:00 A.M. Parking is limited to two hours duration for each vehicle from 9:00 A.M. to 7:00 P.M. on the south side of Main Street.

Section 5. During periods of snow emergency, to be declared by the Village Board of Trustees, parking shall be prohibited on the east side of Spring Street, South Main Street, Raspberry Lane and Renwick Street; the north side of Fromer Street and Penrose Park; and the west side of Park Lane and Tompkins Street.

Section 6. Parking is prohibited in the Village Parking Lot from November 1st to April 1st between 5:00 A.M. and 9:00 A.M. on the outside perimeter, east side along Pratts Building, north side along the creek, and west side along the supermarket.

Section 7. Any motor vehicle in the Village during the period November 1st to April 1st not equipped with snow tires or chains, or equivalent shall be in violation of this ordinance if such vehicle becomes snowbound on a village street.


Section 8. Parking is prohibited on the north side of Main Street except in a designated area in front of the Post Office for a period not to exceed 15 minutes.

Section 9. In the event any section of this ordinance is held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction such holding shall not effect the validity of the remaining sections hereof.

Section 10. Any person violating this ordinance shall be subject to a fine not exceeding twenty-five (\$25.00) Dollars per violation.

Section 11. This ordinance shall take effect ten (10) days after publication as required by the Village Law.
